As a grizzled, sad-eyed homeless man hitchhiking from service station to service to station, making his annual journey from Scotland to

London for the Christmas holiday, Peter Mullan brings warmth and soul to this modest British social drama.

In his debut as writer-director, Jake Gavin, a former photojournalist, casts a sympathetic eye toward society's most invisible members and the quietly heroic people who work in shelters and medical clinics. The screenplay by David Raedeker offers authentic locations mainly base in motorway service stations and hospitals from Glasgow via Newcastle to London. 'Hector' represents a sweet and accessible first effort, anchored to a Mullan performance that is as endearing as it is self-assured.
