Terence Davies has always made films showing how extraordinary ordinary lives can be. In 'Sunset

Song' he centres on the life of Chris Guthrie; brought up on a distant farm in northern Scotland by an authoritarian father (played by Peter Mullan) in a large family, Davies takes us through her love of the land, and the love of a man before the first world war swamps everything. Although the farming life is hard, providing few if any luxuries, Chris is instinctively connected to the land and it gives her a strength to return to as the years pass.

The story comes from the great Scottish novel by Lewis Grassic Gibbon, and Davies 'mines a rich seam of passion and tragedy in the story... (and) brings

out the Hardyesque nature of this story' – Peter Bradshaw, Guardian.

Agyness Deyn (seen here in her first real role in 'Electricity' last year) has won praise for her portrayal of the main character, Chris, and Peter Mullan ('Hector' from 3 weeks ago) is made for roles like her father.
